Full Arch Edentulous Implant Treatment:

Patient Selection, Case Acceptance, Treatment and On-Going Care and Maintenance

The treatment of complete and single arch edentulism is a significant priority for dental clinicians and patients in need.

Many edentulous patients desire a fixed treatment option and have had poor experiences with traditional removable treatment options. The concept of immediate implant placement and temporization is attractive to patients, due to shorter treatment times, and a more predictable outcome. Additionally, there are many patients with a failing or "terminal" dentition who are aware of the 'All on Four' Procedure, and are actively pursuing this treatment.

Participants will learn who to treat, how to explain the treatment and associated fees, and how to promote the 'All on Four' approach in clinical practice. Participants will learn how to identify and evaluate appropriate candidates for such treatment, and discuss immediate placement and loading of implants with 'All on Four' prosthesis. Treatment will be reviewed from a combined surgical / restorative perspective. There will be specific attention paid to the smile line, transition line, emergence profile, abutment selection, and prosthetic / surgical communication will be emphasized.
